# About the University

Located in the heart of the historic and spiritual city of Multan, The Women University Multan (WUM) has the distinction of becoming the first university for the women of Multan. To keep pace with the ever-growing demand for educational reforms, a persistent evolutionary process is needed that can transform a newly established university into a hub of knowledge. In order to reap the benefits of knowledge dissemination, a proposal for setting up the university was designed that can serve the national interest in a broad framework. To compete on par with the global standards, a comprehensive and focused education revamp was demanded in the form of an institution that could serve the inhabitants of the city as well as the nation altogether. It could be a matter of elation for the local fraternity to find an institute of advanced studies in their vicinity, easily accessible to the female knowledge seekers.

The transition of the Government Postgraduate Women College into the Women University took place in 2012 under the Act approved by Punjab Assembly in 2010, transforming it into one of the campuses of WUM. Hence, the new women university has the advantage and privilege of carrying forward the incredible academic standing of the college. Another campus building at Mattital Road has also been completed for providing an ambitious plan of the university for the years to come. The Women University Multan has multifaceted goals and plans which it is committed to achieve in the years to come. In its own role, the university emphasizes the exploration of values, sense of community and grooming of the talent of the students. For this purpose, the university has given the opportunity to those individuals in the form of faculty who could serve as inspiring mentors and role models. More importantly, it is offering ground breaking research facilities to excel in meeting the global challenges of the future. The mission is to highlight the importance of education which can serve as a gear to empower women.

The primary purpose of the Women University Multan is to provide a learning environment in which faculty, staff and students can discover, examine critically, innovate and create the knowledge, wisdom and values that will help ensure the survival of this and future generations and improve the quality of life for all. The university seeks to help students to develop perspectives and appreciation for the complex cultural and physical worlds in which they live and to realize their highest potential in terms of intellectual, physical and human development.

It also strives to attract students from diverse social and economic backgrounds. It aims to be committed and responsive to those communities of women who do not have easy access to higher education. To this end, the university offers broad and balanced academic programs that are mutually supportive and emphasize high quality and creative instruction at the undergraduate, postgraduate, graduate and professional levels.

The university maintains a high level of excellence and standard in all programs that provide students with opportunities to engage in research and activities of national and international significance. The main focus of the university is to attract, educate and equip students to take up best informed career and social choices.

University offers BS, M.Sc/MA, M.Phil. and Ph.D programs in various disciplines under semester system.

In the initial stages, WUM was only housed in the Katchery Campus of Government Degree College for Women, Multan. But this space was insufficient for university activities. The realization of this need led to the establishment of a new campus which is situated at Mattital road, Multan. Mattital campus building is almost complete. Administration block, central library, cafeteria, medical center, security set up/panel, sewerage

system/lines, roads/pathways, boundary wall have been completed. The faculty and students' hostels are also ready for accommodation. Since 2017, Departments of Botany, Zoology, Environmental Sciences and Microbiology and Molecular Genetics have been shifted to Mattital Campus. Remaining departments are planned to be shifted to the Mattital Campus in the next phase soon, IA. University buses and shuttle service are available from Katchery Campus to Mattital campus for the staff and students.

# **Executive Summary**

The Women University Multan, since its inception in 2013, has transformed into one of the premier institutions of national recognition through imparting quality education with research in the disciplines of Social Sciences, IT, Management Sciences, Life Sciences, Languages and Religion. The university has leaped forward in academics by offering undergraduate, postgraduate, MS/M.Phil and Ph.D Programs. Departments of Biochemistry and Biotechnology, Botany, Zoology, Environmental Sciences and Microbiology and Molecular Genetics have been successfully running in Mattital Campus. The rest of the departments are successfully running in the Katchery Campus. University buses and shuttle service are available from Katchery Campus to Mattital campus for the staff and students.

During the academic year 2019-20, faculty members regularly attended national/international conferences/workshops/seminars/ symposiums to share/transfer knowledge in different scientific fields within the country and globally. The faculty members were also encouraged to improve their qualification and visit universities abroad to update their technical and subject-based knowledge from international universities/ institutes; some of them have returned and are serving the university. During the year, faculty members of different departments of the university obtained short term training, doctoral/post-doctoral fellowships and executed research work in UK, USA and Germany among other countries. Since March 2020, due to COVID-19 pandemic, the faculty immediately got engaged in online teaching and braved the challenge with great courage and competence. Webinars, online national and international workshops, lectures and research workshops were arranged by different academic departments.

The Women University Multan is following National Quality Assurance Practices based on HEC's QAA guidance in formulating academic procedures including programme design, teaching and learning student engagement, internal examination and research. The Women University Multan is continuously striving for the quality enhancement of its programs through increasing linkages, strengthening collaborations and building institutional image. The provision of better research facilities encouraged the faculty to publish quality research papers in national and international reputed journals. Until now, 09 MoUs have been signed between WUM and different institutions and organizations for academic and research sharing. University is offering PEEF, need-based scholarship, Bait-ul-Mal, EHSAAS and foreign scholarship to the deserving students from Government of Punjab, HEC and its own resources. The university has established linkages with the industries for promoting entrepreneurship besides establishment of university-industry consortia and business incubation center. University has also geared up its resources to further enhance its role in increasing employability for students of all disciplines.

The Office of Research Innovation and Commercialization (ORIC) has been structured and re-engineered to meet the HEC requirements and to reach out to the relevant industry to help research and innovation find direction and purpose. The research activities have also been stepped up with the launch of 10 academic journals; the first issue of all these journals came out in June 2020. These journals are being developed further under ORIC to reach out to the most relevant and useful audience. Six national and international conferences

have been organized during the year in collaboration with leading universities of the country alongside governmental and non-governmental national and international organizations to enhance the learning experience of the participants and students.

There has been 60% increase in research publications by the faculty. Four research students have been awarded Ph.D degree. 12 new students have started their Ph.D degree research, despite the fact that 4 of the Ph.D programs were given a halt status due the shortage of the teaching faculty. The university is unable to induct new faculty as the service statutes of the university are under approval process. The university will start the faculty induction as soon as the service statutes are approved by the competent authority. Faculty members have presented papers in national and international conferences. Webinars and interviews with eminent scientists and professionals further expanded the learning experiences of the faculty and students.

Academics and student engagement through training and outreach program has been another important focus of the Women University Multan. Boot camps for entrepreneurship training and other online training sessions marked the year for students and faculty. Curriculum review and cataloging has also been a focus. Under student engagement and learning experience, visits to leading educational public and private organizations helped students develop important academic and research links. Visits to LUMS, Lahore, and NUST, Islamabad, were particularly appreciated by the students. Web TV, Web Radio, social media channels including Facebook platform have been established to keep students, faculty and staff actively engaged with university by becoming active participants through this media network.

The Women University Multan strives to be a professional organization with appropriate policy making and a set up with efficient mechanism for good governance and operations. Each administrative and academic department has been restructured for more effective and efficient operation and functions. Training of HR and faculty are considered a significant contributor in the overall development of the university. Staff and faculty have attended training sessions regularly to upgrade their skills and knowledge about their specific area of working. On the whole, the Women University Multan is committed to play its part in the training and nurturing of students, faculty and HR as human capital for the development of the country.





# FACULTY OF ARTS AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

# **DEPARTMENT OF APPLIED PSYCHOLOGY**

#### **Overview**

Department of Applied Psychology was established in 2013. This department offers BS Applied Psychology (4-years) and M.Sc. Applied Psychology (2 Years). Submission of a large number of applications for admissions in different programs each year is indicative of not only the reputation of the subject of Applied Psychology but also of the quality of teaching and research in the Department of Applied Psychology. The scope of the program is to prepare the students for careers in teaching, health, assessment, research, community services to meet the demand in different sectors such as Industry, Military, Government, Mental Health, Social Welfare, Counselling and Guidance Centers, Educational Departments, Prisons, NGOs and Police and Rescue Departments.

# **DEPARTMENT OF ART AND DESIGN**

#### **Overview**

Multan is a city rich in history and famous for its arts, crafts and unique culture. The Department of Fine Arts was established in 1976. In 1985, the Fine Arts graduation program was started in view of the keen interest in the discipline. However, during transition period from Postgraduate College to Women University Multan, intake in the department reduced considerably, with college faculty members either repatriating or retiring. The department came to a halt as it required efforts to revive it. In the year 2019-2020, the department focused on redesigning the curriculum keeping in view the HEC guidelines. A complete BS program and diploma in Art and Design has been developed. Diploma in Art and Design will be launched in Spring, 2020, and BS in Art and Design in Fall, 2012. The main aim of these programs is to develop in the students an aesthetics sense and demonstrate a free and bold style of drawing and painting. Students will be encouraged to develop their skills and free up their line and styles in different media and they will be imparted comprehensive knowledge about the history of civilization and its arts, crafts and architecture.

The Arts and Design students of Intermediate section participated in painting/poster competition under topic "Haq Say HaqdarTak (Safer Charity)" by Ministry of Information. Its prize distribution ceremony was held on 3<sup>rd</sup> May, 2019, in old University Hall and students secured first and third positions at district level.

#### **INSTITUTE OF COMPUTER SCIENCES & INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY**

#### **Overview**

Established in 2013, the Institute of Computer Science and Information Technology has developed strong academic and research programs to become one of the leading establishments in this field. This institute has nine faculty members including one assistant professor and eight lecturers who are well versed to conduct academic and research activities at national and international levels. The Institute of CS and IT started MCS

(Evening) program in 2014, BS (IT) program in 2015 and MIT program in 2016. In 2017, students in MCS (M) were also enrolled. Our two programs BS (CS) and BS (IT) have been accredited with NCEAC (National Computing Education Accreditation Council), HEC (Higher Education Commission) since December, 2015.

# **DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY**

The Department of Chemistry was established in 1953 and was working under the umbrella of Government Post Graduate College Multan. The Department has now been upgraded to offer BS (4-years), M.Sc., M.Phil/MS and Ph.D programs under The Women University Multan. Curricula have been developed under the guideline of Higher Education Commission to cover all the latest developments in the field of Chemistry. The Department has qualified faculty with diversified fields of interest. It has five divisions:

#### **DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS**

The Department of Physics is the oldest seat of learning and imparting knowledge of physics at the intermediate and graduate levels in Southern Punjab. It has been imparting knowledge of Physics to the learners of this region since 1960. The BS Program was initiated in 2010. In 2013, the Department was merged in The Women University Multan. The Department has its own well-equipped laboratories and lecture rooms. To improve knowledge of students, there is a vast collection of books of physics in the main library.

The Department is conducting teaching and experimental work at BS, M.Sc., and M.Phil., Ph.D. levels. A well trained and dedicated faculty together with well-equipped laboratories make this Department one of the most accomplished departments. It is worth mentioning here that a reasonable number of students and graduates from this Department are working in prestigious organizations and serving the nation.

The Department of Statistics is well equipped to conduct teaching/research activities under the supervision of highly qualified faculty members. BS 4-Years program was started in 2010 in the old Govt. Post

Graduate College for Women Kutchery Road Multan (GPCWM) that later merged into the Women University Multan on 24<sup>th</sup> February, 2013. In the very second academic year (2015-16) of the university, M.Phil. in Statistics was offered with full vigour. The first successful session of M.Phil. program passed out in 2017.A well-equipped computer laboratory and HEC smart university internet is facilitating the academic and research activities. The Department frequently conducts different workshops to enhance the learning of the statistical software packages and languages.

BS Statistics is running successfully in the Department. 48 students were admitted during the session 2019-2020.M.Phil Statistics is running successfully in the Department. 7 students were admitted during the session 2019-2020.

Zoology as a subject is multidisciplinary in nature, involving the study of organisms and their genetic, morphological and physiological attributes, their surrounding environment, and their role in the conservation of environment. Zoology is a combination of various disciplines such as Genetics, Physiology, Ecology, Developmental Biology, Microbiology, Parasitology, Entomology, Freshwater Biology, Fisheries, Cell and Molecular Biology and Wildlife etc. These subjects have a significant role in human resource development, food security, environmental conservation, sustainable development which ultimately leads to elimination of poverty.

# **INSTITUTE OF MANAGEMENT SCIENCES**


#### Overview



#### **CHAPTER3**

### **QUALITY ASSURANCE**

#### **OVERVIEW**

The progress of any country depends on the quality of human resources in various sectors of the economy. Universities play a significant role in producing and ensuring the quality of human resources. The Higher Education Commission (HEC) has been emphasizing the importance of higher education through the establishment of Quality Enhancement Cells (QECs) at all public and private sector universities. The function of QEC, in all institutions of higher education, is to implement quality policies and programs as advised by National Quality Assurance Committee of Higher Education Commission of Pakistan. The Women University Multan is also committed to quality in higher education and has, therefore, established an independent QEC within its campus.

#### **OBJECTIVES OF QEC-WUM**

The strategic quality objectives of the QEC are:

- Development and implementation of QE policies and procedures of Higher Education Commission, Pakistan
- Capacity building of WUM faculty & staff
- Assessment of the current status of educational quality at departmental level
- Audit of the educational processes and initiation of measures for the enhancement of education & research quality
- Monitoring the implementation of the recommendations made
- Review of academic collaboration with other institutions in terms of effective management of standards and quality of programs
- Internationalization of WUM

#### **FUNCTIONS**

- To strengthen academic collaboration with reputable National/International universities/organizations in order to bring the quality of education and research at par with international standards
- To get feedback from students, teachers, graduates, parents, employers and other stakeholders on prescribed intervals.
- To evaluate the feedback and suggest appropriate measures to concerned quarters for implementation if deemed necessary
- To enhance the confidence of faculty members, students, their parents, regulatory bodies and society at large in the quality of education imparted at WUM.

#### **IMPACT OF QUALITY ENHANCEMENT CELL**

Quality Enhancement Cells have been established in universities to ensure the provision and maintenance of quality education and research in the field of higher education and also to monitor the ongoing quality assurance measures in every university. The impact of quality assurance measures undertaken by QEC and the changes it has brought about in WUM are hereby outlined below :-

- Created the awareness about self-assessment, its procedures and implementation at departmental level.
- Streamlined the maintenance of faculty folders of Bachelors, Masters, M.Phil and Ph.D Degree programs.
- Lesson plan and course material files are being maintained and distributed among students.
- Streamlined the educational processes i.e. admission, registration and guidance to students etc.

#### SELFASSESSMENT PROGRESS

Self-assessment is an important tool for quality assurance as it provides feedback to the management to initiate action plan for improvement. The same procedure has also been adopted by the Women University Multan. The data is collected by using Self Assessment Manual for the purpose of self-assessment of a particular academic program. Quality Enhancement Cell at the Women University Multan is continuously striving for implementation of SAM at departmental level.

The salient features of self-assessment are as under:-

- It helps in the maintenance and continuous enhancement of performance.
- It enhances the effectiveness of the output.
- It verifies that the existing activities have met their objectives and institutional goals.
- It provides feedback for quality assurance to the management.

Self-assessment activities have been successfully completed for all programs in all departments of WUM.

#### WUM STRUGGLING FOR QUALITY ASSURANCE IN E-LEARNING

The Covid-19 pandemic created a situation in which universities were required to shift from face-to-face oncampus teaching to online teaching and learning systems. WUM has taken initiative to digitalize teaching and learning system while struggling hard to assure quality in E-learning. Detailed policy on online teaching and learning has been prepared by QEC in this regard and has been published separately.

Efforts of WUM faculty and staff are commendable who worked tirelessly round the clock to contribute to this challenge.

It was extremely challenging to adopt a new system but, due to the untiring efforts of the faculty and IT team, this milestone has been achieved. It is also noteworthy to mention that WUM was able to achieve 93.04 percent score in evaluation conducted by HEC through data submission to HEDR, a central data repository maintained by Higher Education Commission of Pakistan and, hence, bringing the young university at far better position than most of the established universities in Pakistan.

This assessment was made by HEC on the basis of the following parameters: Institutional Readiness, Course Readiness, Faculty Readiness, Technology Readiness, Library Readiness, Student Readiness, Evaluation Readiness, and Laboratory Readiness.


#### **Institutional Readiness**

WUM has acquired Moodle LMS (Learning Management System) for online teaching and learning where teachers can create and disseminate e-content in the four quadrant approach to their students in a flexible manner. A transparent policy and SOPs have been adopted to determine the capacity of courses and to certify that these courses can be taught through online means.

For quality assurance and monitoring of online classes, the University has launched three-tier evaluation process i.e., first evaluation at departmental level in Departmental Course Review Committee (DCRC), second stage of approval at Subcommittee of Online Accreditation Council (SOAC) lead by Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) and Task Force constituted for the continuous monitoring of online education. Final approval is done by Online Accreditation Council (OAC). Online Academic Council has also approved all the policies and SOPs for online education developed by the University.








#### **Governance for Quality Assurance**

A governing system has been introduced to approve online courses, examination and assessment strategies, and also to ensure their continuous monitoring. For this purpose, the following committees have been notified:

#### **Guidelines for Developing Online Courses**



#### Preparedness of Faculty for Online Teaching

- Keeping in view the fact that online teaching has different requirements from face-to-face teaching, comprehensive online training sessions have been conducted for faculty to enhance the quality of online teaching and to learn about using LMS, online techniques and resources. Training has been conducted to record online lectures by using software e.g., Zoom.
- Recording studio has been set up at campus to assist faculty in lecture recording process.



## The Women University Multan ranked at 601+ in University Impact Rankings 2020 by The Times Higher Education World University Rankings

The Women University Multan has been ranked at 601+ in the World University Impact Rankings 2020 as released by the Times Higher Education. WUM participated in impact ranking for the first time

exhibiting its commitment to sustainability and making a positive social impact through its partnerships, research, teaching, community engagement and knowledge transfer. Director, Quality Enhancement Cell, is the focal person for data entry for these rankings.

THE Impact Rankings in fact show how the global higher education sector is working towards the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). There are 17 SDGs which were adopted by the UN in 2015 to provide a framework to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all. These include ending poverty and hunger, promoting good health and well-being and quality education, achieving gender equality and economic growth, providing access to clean water and sanitation and affordable and clean energy, fostering innovation, reducing inequalities, building sustainable cities and communities and achieving responsible consumption and production, tackling climate change, managing sustainably life below water and life on land, promoting peaceful societies, and revitalizing global partnerships.

WUM submitted evidence on 5 of the 17 SDGs.



#### SDG 5: Gender Equality Rank: 101-200

As the first university for women in Multan, the university seeks to highlight the importance of education and its ability to empower women. Its mission is to provide encouragement, support and opportunity to its female students to help them grow and develop into successful graduates.



#### SDG 15: Life on Land Rank: 201+

A flourishing life on land is the foundation of our life on this planet. We are all part of the planet's ecosystem and we have caused severe damage to it through deforestation, loss of natural habitats and land degradation. Promoting a sustainable use of our ecosystems and preserving biodiversity is not a cause; it is the key to our own survival. WUM aims to protect, restore, and promote sustainable use of

terrestrial ecosystems and halt and reverse land degradation and stop biodiversity loss.

The Women University Multan was originally the Kutchery Campus of Government Degree College for Women. It became the Women University in 2012 under the 2010 Act approved by the Punjab Assembly. The university has five faculties offering both undergraduate and postgraduate courses. Students can choose to study arts and social sciences, life sciences, sciences, religion and languages,

or economics, commerce and management sciences. Within each faculty, there are several departments specializing in particular areas.



#### FACULTY DEVELOPMENT




## VIDEO CONFERENCING

# Establishment of Women University Multan (PM Directive)

Upon Prime Minister's directive, the government land consisting of 218-K,6-M area was allotted at the Mattital Road and PC-I was approved titled "Establishment of Women University Multan (Prime Minister's Directive)". The development activities were initially started by the HEC and then project was transferred to the Women University, Multan, in June 2013. The project is in its final stages since most of civil works are completed.


# Land Acquisition


## Master Plan (Mattital Campus)




## **Kinship Based Fee Concession**

# CHAPTER 13 HEALTH CENTRE/ OTHER RELATED FACILITIES

#### **MEDICAL FACILITIES**

Health care of students and staff has always been considered as the priority at WUM. To fulfill this purpose, the university has a fully equipped on-campus Health Center looked after by a female doctor. The University Health Center provides the first aid and medical assistance for minor emergencies. This Health Center provides the health facilities to all students and staff throughout the year. 24-hours ambulance service is also available at WUM.

#### HOSTEL

WUM has two hostels (Amna Hall & Ayesha Hall) at Katchery Campus for its students with all basic facilities including mess with a total capacity of 650 students. The hostels are located inside the building of the university to provide the students secure stay in campus. Due to inside facility of accommodation, students are extremely close to campus being a short walk away from their classes and university building. The university also has two faculty hostels to facilitate its staff with capacity of almost 36 rooms. Recently, a student hostel as well as staff residency & guest house have been established at Mattital Campus. All the matters related to the students' hostels and faculty hostel are being administered by the Chairperson Hall Council and are coordinated through the hostel warden. There is strict 24/7 security check and procedures to ensure safety and security of students who are residing in hostels.

#### DAY CARE CENTRE

Due to the acute demand of faculty and staff members, WUM Daycare Center has been established in Katchery and Mattital Campus. A Day Care Centre is a place where learning and fun become one. It is the primary place where young children learn social and pre-academic skills necessary for success in school. WUM Daycare Center is a place where children are safe and happy. The center provides numerous opportunities for children to experience wonder, pleasure, and delight. Parents feel confident and secure leaving their children in the center.

## **CAREER COUNSELING CENTER**

The availability of a good career counseling platform at educational institutions is necessary for building a strong career of their students. WUM has established a Career Counseling Center which helps students in their educational guidance and counseling services throughout their stay at the university. The Center assists the students in their personal and educational development. It also advises them regarding their career options and opportunities. It helps in building the industrial linkages with various external organizations for creating internship and job opportunities for its students.

#### HOSTELCOUNSELING PSYCHOLOGY

Counseling psychologists at WUM help students with emotional, physical and mental health issues. They also provide assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of more severe psychological symptoms and issues related to learning difficulties i.e., difficulty in reading (dyslexia) and writing (dysgraphia) and difficulty with mathematics (dyscalculia). Confidentiality is part of psychology's code of ethics and is maintained to protect individuals' medical records and personal health information, including information about psychotherapy and mental health.

#### **DAR-UL-QURAN**

WUM has established an Islamic Center at a central location in the university. There are arrangements for prayer for all students. This center is running under the supervision of a full-time teacher who monitors the activities of Islamic Center and teaches the Quran to interested university students. The Center also arranges different religious events in the university.

# BANK & ATM

WUM has HBL ATM facility inside the building of university to provide safe ATM transactions to university administration, staff and students. Branches of HBL and MCB are also under construction. The purpose of such facilities is to ensure a secure and comfortable stay of students on campus.

### CAFETERIA

For refreshment and enjoyment of the students during their stay on campus, the university has a cafeteria at both campuses. The cafeteria offers a relaxing place to the students to eat, drink and for their social interaction. Senior faculty members monitor the activities of cafeteria to provide quality and hygienic food to the students of the university.

#### **PRINTING PRESS**

The development of printing press has modified the teaching enterprise. Keeping in view this important fact, the Women University, Multan, has established a state-of-the-art printing press since September, 2015, to fulfill the entire printing needs of the university. The printing press is equipped with advanced machinery and the equipment of excellent quality in the area of printing and publications. A dedicated and experienced staff is working efficiently for completing the tasks of designing prospectus, answer sheets, question papers, newsletter, brochures, registers, budget books, conferences/workshops material, result cards, certificates, ID cards, various types of form and lots of other printing items.

#### SECURITY DIVISION

Due to the current law and order situation in the country, it is a mandatory requirement for every educational institution to provide an efficient security system for the safety of its students and staff. Within available resources, WUM has a very vigilant security system. There are specified entry/exit gates with proper checking and record maintenance of credentials of entrants and parking of vehicles at safe place. Security cameras are placed at important locations. Search lights and establishment of CCTV control room are also the security measures taken by the university. Walk through gates and metal detectors are also available within the university. Male and female security guards do patrol day and night. The university has also ensured the provision of identification cards to students, staff and visitors for effective security services.
